

ADMISSION -INFORMATION-



- Admission to the college is strictly on merit basis and subject to the approval of the Admission Committee.
- March There is reservation of seats for ST, SC, OBC, MOBC and physically challenged as per govt. rules. A few seats are reserved for the students having outstanding performances in co-curricular activities. These seats are allotted on merit cum proficiency in the concerned field. Candidates have to submit valid documents from the competent authority, if they apply under this category.
- Candidates are required to produce original mark sheet of last qualifying examination, admit card and original pass certificate from the Head of the institution last attended and caste certificate (if applicable) at the time of interview. Physically challenged students must produce the necessary certificate from the competent authority to that effect. Students, who passed qualifying examination earlier than the current year, must submit a gap certificate regarding their activities during this period to the satisfaction of the authority.
- ✓ Students can apply for Major course if he/she secures 50% marks in the concerned subject.
- Students who opt to Major Course have to consult with the concerned Department.
- Admission to the college takes place on the day of the interview on payment of the necessary dues.
- $\overline{\mathbf{v}}$ Regular classes will start as per notification by the principal.
- All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of G.U.



All prospective students who wish to take admission into the GU-FYUGP, either through an affiliated college or through the FYUGP @ GU Campus, must be registered with the ABC and must obtain the 12-digit ABC ID through the Digilocker platform.

Students are encouraged to visit the ABC Website for all related information which are available along with video tutorial.

The broad admission procedure for GU-FYUGP is given in the GU-FYUGP Regulations. Some of the important points regarding admission into the GU-FYUGP through an affiliated colleges are given below.

- Admission to the GU-FYUGP should be based on desired Major of a student.
- If a student DOES NOT opt for Major, a college can devise their own rule to admit a student, based on their available infrastructure and resources.
- All syllabi including Core and Common Courses will be available by June 2025 through GU's Syllabut Portal at https://syllabus.gauhati.ac.in/fyugp.
- A college should encourage the students to obtain their respective ABC ID at the time of admission, as this will be required for Registration at GU (see below).
- All admitted students MUST register with Gauhati University (one time) immediately after the admission. The GU Registration Facility will be open immediately after the admission process is completed.
- A college can offer admission into GU-FYUGP in all subjects that are available in the Subject Page, provided they have the requisites permission from GU as well as from the Government, if any.
- Whether a college can offer Major option in a subject listed in the Subject Page is governed by existing GU rules.

Gauhati University has implemented educational programmes structured under NEP-2020 from Academic Session i.e. from 2023. It has been a quite a bit of challenge to roll out the NEP-enabled programme, especially with over more than 300 affiliated colleges ranging across the length and breadth of the State of Assam.

Our flagship programme under NEP 2020 will be the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme, code named GU-FYUGP (or FYUGP), which is the four-year Bachelor's Degree programme with multiple entries and exits. This is being implemented in all affiliated colleges under Gauhati University as well as in the University Campus. With over more than 40 (forty) diverse subjects under the programme, this has been one of the biggest academic exercises, the university has carried out since the implementation of the semester system in undergradute level. All new admissions to the Bachelor's Degree programme will be under GU-FYUGP (Gauhati University) starting from academic session 2023-24.

*Four year Undergraduate course under NEP (FYUGP)

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curricular Framework, published in November 2022. The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS). Under the NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme with the provision of multiple exits and entries, leading to the award of certificate, diploma or a degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.

The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme — (i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline. The FYUGP is divided into two parts — (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses. The minimum credit allocation for a 3-year programme is 84 credits in Core Courses and 36 credits in Common Courses, which comes to a total of minimum 120 credits for a 3-year programme. With the fourth year, the minimum credit requirements becomes 160. A student can however earn up to a maximum of 132 credits in a 3-year programme and 176 by the fourth year.

*Core courses

The core courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively. Total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the core courses, which translates to 21 courses (i.e. papers) with a credit allocation of 4 per course (paper). A student will need to study at least two core subjects. The core courses have to be chosen among a plethora of subjects offered in our college (see the section 2.02 for subject studied in our college) for both the types of degrees, respectively. In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, the components of the core courses are major and minors, while in case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no majors and minors.

*Major and Minor Courses

In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. A Major course must carry a minimum credit of 60 and a Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 12.

*Common courses

The common courses have to be studied by all students alike and all-together they carry a total credits of 36 over a 3-years period. These courses are further divided into five (5) subcategories, as described below :-

i. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Communication. Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each – one from English Communication and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be studied during Semesters 1-2.

ii. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9 have to be studied during Semesters 1-3, each having 3 credits.

iii. Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC)

These are 3-credit courses spanning over two different groups of subjects in our college- (i) Library and Information Science (ii) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of Class XII. Each student needs to take at any three papers, each with 3-credits from these sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

iv. Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses in our College will have two sub groups- (a) Understanding India, and (b) Environmental Education. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6 to be completed during semester 1, 2 and 3.

v. Internship

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4 (Credit added to 5th Semester). Those who miss the Internship in 4th-5th Summer Break have to do the Internship after the 6th Semester (during 6th Semester Summer Break). In such cases, the 5th Semester result shall not be completed.

The fourth year:

In the FYUGP, the fourth year is at par with the first year of a Master's programme, as a student can directly take admission into the second year of a Master's programme after the successful completion of the FYUGP. In the fourth year, a student has to complete one compulsory paper on Research Methodology (REM) in the Semester VII, which is a 4-credit theory paper. The rest of courses will consist of Advanced Core Courses and a Dissertation.

FUTURE VISION

The minimum educational qualification for admission into B.Voc. Degree course will be 10+2 Examination passed (any stream) or equivalent Examination from any recognized Board/Council/University.



Academic Session

The academic session 2025-26 starts in August till December in semester system and 1st semester ends in December 2025, 2nd semester starts in January 2026 and ends in June, 2026. This is in conformity with the regulations of Gauhati University to which the college is affiliated.

Attendance

It is obligatory for every student to attend the classes punctually and regularly. Attendance of a student in the Degree Course must not be less than 75% of the total lectures delivered in an academic year, as per G.U. norms. Promotion to appear in the final examination a student must qualify the minimum attendance as per norms.

College Hours

The working hour of the college is from 8.30 AM to 5.30 PM The class hour is 9.00 AM to 5.00 PM

Identity Card

An identity card is issued to every student at the time of admission. It shall contain information of the holder along with a recent passport size photograph duly attested by the Principal. The student must keep it ready to produce whenever asked for. Identity card is not transferable.



Students' Union

Patidarrang College Students' union is the General Body of the students of the college. All the regular students of the college are the members of the union. The Principal of the college is the president of the Students' union. If necessary the principal may appoint an Asstt./Asso. Professor as the working president. The members of the Students' Union Body are elected by the students annually conducted by an Election Committee constituted by the Principal. The Election Committee consists of one teacher as Returning Officer and three other members from the teaching staff for smooth conduct of the students' union election every year. The Principal has the right to dissolve the Union Body at any time on disciplinary ground and constitute an ad-hoc body till a fresh election is held.
