



ADMISSION INFORMATION



- Prospectus and Application Forms are available in the college office on payment of Rs. 200/- (Rupees Two Hundred) only.
- Admission to the college is strictly on merit basis and subject to the approval of the Admission Committee.
- There is reservation of seats for ST, SC, OBC, MOBC and physically challenged as per govt. rules. A few seats are reserved for the students having outstanding performances in co-curricular activities. These seats are allotted on merit cum proficiency in the concerned field. Candidates have to submit valid documents from the competent authority, if they apply under this category.
- Candidates are required to produce original mark sheet of last qualifying examination, admit card and original pass certificate from the Head of the institution last attended and caste certificate (if applicable) at the time of interview. Physically challenged students must produce the necessary certificate from the competent authority to that effect. Students, who passed qualifying examination earlier than the current year, must submit a gap certificate regarding their activities during this period to the satisfaction of the authority.
- Students can apply for Honours course if he/she secures 50% marks in the concerned subject.
- Students who opt to Honours Course have to consult with the concerned Department.
- Admission to the college takes place on the day of the interview on payment of the necessary dues.
- Regular classes will start as per notification by the principal.
- All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of G.U.







- Application for Admission to the College should be made in Online Application Forms available on the college website.
- Admission is done strictly on merit basis and is governed by the Admission rules of the College. The decision of the Principal in this regard is final.
- Applicants will have to appear in person at the time of admission with original copies of Pass Certificate, Marksheet, Age Certificate, Character Certificate (from the Heads of the institution last attended), Caste Certificate (where necessary) and any other document notified from time to time.
- No application will be accepted after the last date of submission.
- Reservation of Seats will be entertained as per Govt. rules.
- Extra Curricular (EC) quota will be maintained as per Govt. norms in all classes.



General Instructions

- Any form of ragging in the College premises is strictly prohibited, violation of which invites strong disciplinary actions. It is mandatory to submit an ANTI-RAGGING SELF DECLARATION in stipulated format within 15 days of admission.
- Smoking, consuming Gutkha and taking intoxicating drugs are strictly prohibited in the College campus.
- Students must come in proper College Uniform.
- Students must maintain decorum and foster high standard of discipline by words and deeds.
- Blowing horns and any kind of annoying noises in the College campus are strictly prohibited.
- The College Identity Card issued to each student is to be brought to the College everyday and the same is to be produced when asked for.
- Students should go through the Notice Board at the time of entry & exit every day.
- Terms and conditions embodied in the Prospectus are liable to be modified and revised whenever necessary.
- Students are advised to open a savings bank account in their individual names in any nationalized bank for their convenience.
- For higher studies/scholarship PRC is mandatory. Students are advised to apply for the same to the concerned authority immediately after admission.
- The students without fees clearance (admission fee and other dues) will not be allowed to participate in college students' union election and other extracurricular activities in the College.
- The decision of the College Authority in any case of admission related dispute is final.



The academic session 2022-23 starts in August till December in semester system and 1st semester ends in December 2022, 2nd semester starts in January 2023 and ends in June, 2023. This is in conformity with the regulations of Gauhati University to which the college is affiliated.

Attendance

It is obligatory for every student to attend the classes punctually and regularly. Attendance of a student in the Degree Course must not be less than 75% of the total lectures delivered in an academic year, as per G.U. norms. Promotion to appear in the final examination a student must qualify the minimum attendance as per norms.

College Hours

The working hour of the college is from 8 AM to 5 PM The class hour is 8.00 AM to 5 PM

Identity Card

An identity card is issued to every student at the time of admission. It shall contain information of the holder along with a recent passport size photograph duly attested by the Principal. The student must keep it ready to produce whenever asked for. Identity card is not transferable.



Students' Union

Patidarrang College Students' union is the General Body of the students of the college. All the regular students of the college are the members of the union. The Principal of the college is the president of the Students' union. If necessary the principal may appoint an Asstt./Asso. Professor as the working president. The members of the Students' Union Body are elected by the students annually conducted by an Election Committee constituted by the Principal. The Election Committee consists of one teacher as Returning Officer and three other members from the teaching staff for smooth conduct of the students' union election every year. The Principal has the right to dissolve the Union Body at any time on disciplinary ground and constitute an ad-hoc body till a fresh election is held.

Suggestion Box

Any-Suggestion from the guardians/students/well wishers related to the development of the college may use the suggestion box of the college. Students/Guardians may express their grievances in black and white and place in the box. These grievances will be rederssed by the concerned cell through discussion with senior faculty members.

ACADEMIC RESOURCES AND FACILITIES

LIBRARY:

A Library is the hub of academic activities. Patidarrang College's Library is one of the best Libraries. It provides efficient service to the readers. It is with open access system consisting of approx 13,700 text books, 1500 reference books, 1 copy Peer reviewed research journal and 6 numbers of monthly journal.

The Library is partially automated with Integrated Library Management system (ILMS) i.e. SOUL 2.0. The Library has connected with INFLIBNET'S NLIST programme. Our Library has recently opted institutional membership of National Digital Library of India. The Library has also developed its Digital Library cum Institutional Repository with open source software "DSPACE" (Cloud based)

Library orientation is conducted in the beginning of the academic session to make the freshers familiar with the Library holdings, services and rules for better use of the Library.

To inculcate the reading habit among the students an award known as "Best Reader Award" is given to the best user every year.

It is remarkable that our library has opened a special cell on Laxminath Bezbaruah's Collection.



IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM WITH 'UNDER GRADUATE CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM' (UG-CBCS)

- A TDC will consist of 6 (Six) Semesters covering three Calendar Years. The Schedule for UG-CBCS (Semester System)shall be as follow:
 - a) First, Third and Fifth Semester (Odd Semester) June November (Including Examination)
 - b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester (Even Semester) December May (Including Examination)
- Students' performance will be monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment in their concerned subjects. Evaluation of the students' performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following:

Internal Evaluation: 20% External Evaluation: 80%

- Internal evaluation will be done by the concerned Deptt. following G.U. guidelines and this evaluation will be based on Attendance, Group Discussion/Assignment/Field Work/Seminar and Sessional Examination.
- 4. External evaluation will be done through a Final Examination towards the end of semester.
- 5. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and in each practical paper is 40%.
- In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
- 7. A student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
 - (a) First Semester with the regular Third Semester Examination.
 - (b) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester Examination.
 - (c) Third Semester with the regular Fifth Semester Examination.
 - (d) Fourth Semester with the regular Sixth Semester Examination.
- 8. A student may be allowed once to reappear in one of the honours theory papers in each of the First, Second and Third Semesters for betterment of marks if the candidate secured pass mark in all papers. Students will be allowed to reappear only in the next similar examination.
- No repeat/betterment will be allowed in the practical Examination in any semester.
- 10. A student must pass all his/her Semester examinations, including "Repeat" and "Betterment" chances within six years from the date of admission of the First Semester course.
- In Semester system, there is no scope for a student to appear as a Private candidate in any Subject.
- N.B.: The existing rules that govern the UG-CBCS (Semester System) are subject to change/ modification as per Gauhati University notification from time to time.

- Generic Elective (GE) Course [Generic Elective for Honours (HG) Programme]: A Generic Elective Course is offered by an unrelated discipline/subject. That is, a student of Honours Programme can choose a Generic Elective course from any other discipline/subject except from the Honours Core itself.
- 7. Credit: A system for computation of work load for a course and it is calculated on the basis of a total teaching period required for the course. Generally, for Theory classes, 1 credit is 1 theory period of one hour duration and for Practical classes, 1 credit is 1 practical period of two hour duration. Here, the No. of credit implies No. of classes in a week.
